## **Shared Access Area**

The **Shared Access Area** is a *statutory component* of any **Accessible Parking Module**. It's governed by **two** sets of laws: **State Road Safety laws**, incorporating the **Australian Road Rules** (as regulations) and the **Commonwealth Disability Discrimination 1992** (DDA) (enacted under the **United Nations Convention on the Rights of People With Disabilities**, to which Australia is a signatory.)

Obstruction of this space is illegal and NO person or organisation has authority to allow any obstruction, including vehicles of any kind, bins, shopping trolleys, barriers, fund-raising stalls, product storage or display, parked mobility scooters, portable toilets, trailers, signs, motorbikes or bicycles.

**Disability Discrimination Act complaints** are heard before the **Australian Human Rights Commission**.

## **Disability Parking Bay**

These spaces are restricted to holders of *valid*, *clearly displayed* **Disability Parking Permits** issued by either Local Councils or by State Government Departments *authorised by law to do so*.

**Emergency vehicles** — *ONLY while attending an emergency* — are also authorised to stop here.

Shopping centre managements, private property owners, police officers, school principals, security personnel, body corporates, parking managers – or anyone else – have **NO authority** to permit or direct any obstruction of these bays by anyone or anything.

If property owners/managements direct or allow **removal** of Accessible Parking, causing the ratio to **fall below** the minimum mandated by their **Planning Permits**, they may be prosecuted for such breaches. Penalties are severe (eg: NSW — up to **\$5 million**.)

Permits are issued ONLY by Local Councils or specific State Government Agencies authorised by law to do so. NOBODY else may issue any kind of permit or authorisation to stop in either of these spaces.
